9 Simple Steps

Those who are successful in relocating follow these nine simple steps:

1. **Have a plan** either to move here and look for a job, or make several trips to meet with employers. Those who move here first have a budget to live on for several weeks or months; otherwise, they secure temporary work while looking for career positions.
2. **Research the Arizona economy** and identify companies, professional associations, and industry leaders for contacts.
3. **Obtain face-to-face meetings** with potential employers and referral sources rather than mailing out resumes or relying on “headhunters,” want ads, and Internet postings.
4. **Sell your home** so you are ready to move.
5. **Have a relocation budget** (i.e., relocation expenses, temporary living, deposits for utilities and phone, etc.)
6. **Have a job-search budget** (job-search trips, long-distance calls, research, professional assistance, etc.)
7. **Have realistic expectations** about salaries in this market.
8. **Focus on job hunting** in Arizona before house hunting.
9. **Take advantage of a mentor** who knows the Arizona job market to coordinate the job search and relocation.

Why do people want to move to Arizona?

- More opportunity
- Better lifestyle
- Climate
- Affordable housing
- To be near family or friends
- Health reasons
- To be with spouse or significant other who already has a job in Arizona
